CMS Environment had organised 7th competitive edition of CMS VATAVARAN – Environment and Wildlife Film Festival and Forum from Jan 30 – Feb 03, 2014 (Thursday – Monday) at Indira Gandhi National Centre for the Arts (IGNCA), Lawns, Near India Gate, New Delhi, India.

The 7th edition aimed to make people informed, motivated and committed towards values of biodiversity conservation through range of outreach, communication and awareness activities and approaches.

1.0 THEME

The theme for this year was mainstreaming biodiversity conservation at different levels to promote living in harmony with nature. The theme was also significant in the context of recently held 11th Conference of Parties (CoP-11) to the United Nations Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD) at Hyderabad, India and UN Decade on Biodiversity 2011 -2020 (65th session of United Nations General Assembly resolution 65/161).

With the new formats and proactive programming, the 7th CMS VATAVARAN was committed to align its efforts in this direction. <u>All endeavours of 7th CMS VATAVARAN contributed to the Aichi Target and Strategic Goals by mainstreaming biodiversity conservation at different level to promote living in harmony with nature.</u> This was the largest ever public outreach programme in India for celebrating CoP 11 presidency. Wildlife Institute of India (WII) was the overall knowledge partner for CMS VATAVARAN 2014.

2.0 FESTIVAL PROCESS

The festival was a two-year long process which included:

2.1 Festival Planning: Consultation Meet, Steering Committee, Expert Advisory Groups (Programmes & Promotion) and Filmmakers Advisory Board

- <u>Consultation Meet</u>: Held on 05 Feb 2013 at CMS, New Delhi to re-strategise and develop future road map for CMS VATAVARAN involving its filmmakers, partners, nomination jury, jury and steering committee members.
- Steering Committee: An 11 member steering committee was formed for a 5-year period commencing from 2013 2017 comprising of eminent dignitaries and experts to provide leadership, overall policy guidance, mentoring of the festival team, facilitating developing knowledge and resource pool for creating sustained impact and promoting environment sensitivity. The steering committee will meet every alternate year during the competitive year. The First Steering Committee Meeting was held on 3 Feb 2014 at

- Expert Advisory Groups (Programmes & Promotion) 2013-2014: The Programme Group constituted for this festival provided their expert guidance on programme content and speakers of the festival. The promotion group worked towards promotion, building visibility & branding of CMS VATAVARAN.
- <u>Filmmakers Advisory Board (5 years, 2013-2017)</u>: This group comprising of CMS VATAVARAN filmmakers was formed to provide direction, guidance and advise in technical, creative and programmes of CMS VATAVARAN Film Festivals.

2.2 Competition, Selection and Awards Process

a. Call for Entries (Jan 2012 - June 2013)

The festival was open to both professional and amateur filmmakers and films completed on or after January 1, 2011 were only invited for the competition. The Call for Entry for the 7th competitive CMS VATAVARAN was announced in March 2012 and continued till June 30, 2013. The 7th competitive edition of CMS VATAVARAN received record submission with **541** entries **(337 International and 204 Indian)** - 41% more than 2011 competitive festival.

The Judging at CMS VATAVARAN was a three-tier process. It consisted of a Peer Review, Nomination Jury and the Award Jury (Indian & International). Entries submitted in CMS VATAVARAN competition are judged on five criteria i.e. Content (Clarity of Idea, message and authenticity of facts and figures); Visual Composition or Cinematography; Sound and Music; Editing and Composition; Presentation, Finish and Overall Impression.

- **Peer Review**: The peer review team comprised of CMS researchers for quality check and appraising the relevance and appropriateness of the film entries.
- Nomination Jury: Total 86 films were nominated (52 Indian and 34 International films including 01 film from Japan) by a 31 member nomination jury headed by Mr Srinivasan Iyer, Assistant Country Director and Head, Energy and Environment Unit, UNDP India. The films selected by the Nomination Jury are presented to the Award Jury for selecting the winning entries. All the nominated films were screened during the festival from Jan 30 Feb 03, 2014 at IGNCA lawns, New Delhi.





 Award Jury (Indian & International): The Indian Award Jury headed by Mr Amol Palekar, Eminent Actor & Director comprising of 7 eminent professionals declared 22 awards in Indian category. The International Award Jury headed by Mr Ramesh Sharma, eminent filmmaker comprising of 6 eminent professionals selected 11 awards in international category.


2.4 Programmes

Consolidating ten glorious year of the CMS VATAVARAN journey, the festival introduced a whole lot of new programmes i.e. more than 112 films, best of world biodiversity cinema, 150 Speakers, 70 sessions, workshops, exhibitions, film booth, green haat, food court, musical festival and much more to commemorate the occasion. Delegates ranging from eminent filmmakers, environmentalists, statesman, experts, organisations, green innovators and media from across the world participated in this environment extravaganza.

Showcasing an eclectic mix of Indian and International films and forum programmes, the 7th CMS VATAVARAN appeared in a new avatar in 2014.

a. Thematic Lawns

The festival programmes were held across **7 venues** in the Indira Gandhi National Centre for the Arts (IGNCA) campus i.e.



Japan Lawn: The Japan lawn was specially curated with the thematic focus on biodiversity of forest, mountain and inland waters & wetland. Some of the important issues and focus of the sessions held in this lawn were Forest Right Act, Tourism in tiger reserves, protected areas, traditional knowledge, human wildlife



conflict, Himalayan biodiversity, and policy issues. COJWE Japan, UNDP, Pragya and Zoo Outreach were knowledge partners.

UNDP and GIZ Lawn: The lawn with the theme of **Coastal and Marine Biodiversity** held screenings and sessions on the issues such as conservation of coastal and marine biodiversity, climate change, livelihood issues, institutional and financial mechanism, etc. UNDP and GIZ – Indo German Biodiversity Programme were the main partners of this lawn. *International Collective in Support of Fishworkers (ICSF) was the knowledge partner*.

CMS Lawn: Sessions, book launches, press briefings and workshops were organised in the CMS Lawn. Some of the issues discussed are India's Draft National Biodiversity Targets, Urban Wetlands, Conservation of Biodiversity Rich Areas Outside the Protected Area Network. Book Launch of First Food: A Taste of India's Biodiversity was also held here by Ms Sunita Narain.

Young Champions Lawn: The Young audiences were treated to film screenings, workshops, painting competitions, sessions, puppetry, etc at the Young Champions Lawn. Not only students, teachers and parents actively participated in various activities organised at the Young Champions Lawn. Some of the interesting sessions were on Environment Education, animal behaviour, western ghats. WTI, CEE and SACON were the knowledge partners.

ONGC Lawn: All the Indian nominated films were screened followed by open forums with the audience at the ONGC Lawn. Yann Arthus – Bertrand's Retrospective was an important part of the ONGC Lawn. Two films by the filmmaker, 'A Thirsty World' and 'Planet Ocean' were screened. Special film screenings and sessions were also part of the this Lawn where prominent speakers such as Dr Ravi Chellam, Vidya Athreya, Sujay Dahake, Nandan Saxena, Kavita Bahl, Bablu Ganguly, and many more.

International Screen: More than 50 films including nominated film in International categories, and partner films of ONGC, Delhi Metro, UNDP were screened at the International screen for four days. Open forum with some of the nominated International filmmakers were also held.

Grand Stage: The five day film festival and forum was not all about films and serious issues. This time we witnessed performances by students, artists, musicians etc in the form of songs, theatre, dance, drum jam, etc. More than 18 performances were organised by CMS VATAVARAN with participation from schools, colleges, academies, groups, and more. Gala Inauguration and awards ceremonies were also held in this lawn.

b. Programme Highlights!

• Inaugural Ceremony: The Inaugural ceremony was scheduled on Jan 30, 2014 (Thursday) from 06:30 – 08:00 pm at IGNCA Lawns, New Delhi. The ceremony was attended by Mr K S Rao Union Minister for Textiles; Dr Karan Singh, MP and President, ICCSR and Ms Lise Grande, UN Resident Coordinator and UNDP Resident Representative



in India. Mr V B Mathur, Senior Professor & Dean, Wildlife Institute of India (WII) and Mr A S Panneerselvan, Executive Director, PANOS South Asia were among the special invitees.

- Indian and International Film Screenings & Open Forums: All 86 nominated films were screened (including 01 film from Japan) during the festival from Jan 30 Feb 03, 2014 at IGNCA lawns, New Delhi. The nominated filmmakers were invited to attend the festival and also participated in the film screenings and open forum discussions post their film screenings i.e. during Open Forums.
- **Film Booth:** All the entries i.e. Indian and international films received during the 7th CMS VATAVARAN were available for viewing to the registered festival delegates and could be accessed country-wise, director-wise, alphabetically or through category or key word search.
- Best of World Biodiversity Cinema: CMS VATAVARAN partnered and organised screenings of award winning films from prominent international environment and wildlife film festivals from across the world.
- Award Nite: The 7th CMS VATAVARAN Awards were bestowed during a gala Award Nite on February 02, 2014 from 06:00 08:00 pm at IGNCA Lawns. CMS VATAVARAN announced 33 awards in 11 categories (Indian and International) on Feb 02, 2014 (Sunday).

The award ceremony was graced by the presence of Dr K S Rao, Minister of Textile, GoI; Shri Amol Palekar, Actor, Director and Producer & Chairperson, 2014 Indian Jury. Felicitation of Special Awards



Nicholas Chorier, aerial photographer had more than 50 photographs on display. National Biodiversity Authority and State Biodiversity Boards, IUCN, PondyCAN, Ryan International School, CMS Environment, Shimla Municipal Corporation were some of the exhibitors.

CMS VATAVARAN for the first time brought together 28 organic farmers, artisans, garment dealers and others at the Green Haat stalls.


All the programmes were organised to promote environment sensitivity at a large scale.

2.5 Logistics (Festival Management)

The 2014 festival involved immense logistics planning and arrangements by CMS including: Administrative arrangements (communication, courier, travel, stationery, office expenses, etc); travel, accommodation; food & refreshments; local transportation for festival delegates, jury members and festival guests; venue creation (structure, lighting, power backup, permissions, etc); festival clearances; décor; equipments; projections; designing and printing of festival's publicity material; delegate registration; on-site and off-site branding; media engagement. Interns and volunteers were hired for promotion and festival management. Awardees trophies and citations were designed. Promos, signature films, media clips, award-clips were produced; Festival merchandise (delegate bags, badges, note books, pens, note pads, t-shirts) were arranged.

3.0 MEDIA PRESENCE

CMS VATAVARAN 2014 was covered widely by a range of national and regional dailies. The coverage reflected the celebration of diversity in nature during the festival. The festival had 48 print media coverage; 11 electronic media coverage including television and radio and 87 online media coverage.

25 Newspaper dailies were present during the festival and covered the festival & its programmes. Among the prominent ones were Asian Age, Daily Pioneer, Dainik Jagran, Deccan Herald, Hindustan, Hindustan Times, Maharashtra Times, Mint, Punjab Kesari, Rashtriya Sahara, Rajasthan Patrika, The Hindu, The Indian Express, The New Indian Express, The Times of India and The Tribune. Overall 9 electronic media organizations covered the festival including Zee News, YouTube, NDTV, Lok Sabha TV, DD National, AIR FM Rainbow, Air FM Gold, AIR Akashvani and BBC. Overall 52 online portals covered the festival.

Some prominent dailies did special features on the issues related to environment and wildlife and the prospect of filmmaking related to these issues, sessions with film personalities like Shabana Azmi, Amol Palekar, Purab Kohli, Girish Malik and Tannishtha Chatterjee. Feature stories on filmmakers such as Sanjay Barnela, nominated filmmakers,



Vijaya Mulay, Jury Chairperson Amol Palekar etc were done by prominent English newspapers.

Food, music, dance, and other attractions also became a focus in this edition of the festival. The electronic media's focus has been on not only the issues on biodiversity but also on these lighter moments during the festival.

In the run-up to the festival new stories dealt with the reason why CMS VATAVARAN chose the theme of mainstreaming biodiversity conservation and categorisation of the sub-themes into coastal and marine biodiversity, forest biodiversity, mountain biodiversity, and inland waters and wetlands biodiversity to discuss on Himalayas, coastal regions, protected areas and Western Ghats. The focus of the print media primarily was on the use of cinema in projecting environmental issues whether it was highlighting the rough tracks that the filmmakers had to take to film on environmental or wildlife issues or how pertinent it becomes for mainstream cinema to take a big role in bringing out these issues.



4.0 CMS VATAVARAN 2014 IMPACT

All endeavours of 7th CMS VATAVARAN contributed to the Aichi Target and Strategic Goals by mainstreaming biodiversity conservation at different level to promote living in harmony with nature. This festival and forum aimed to make people informed, motivated and committed towards values of biodiversity conservation through range of outreach, communication and awareness activities & approaches. This was the largest ever public outreach programme in India for celebrating CoP 11 presidency.



4.1 Low Carbon Footprints

An environment and wildlife film festival like CMS VATAVARAN needs to be 'green' in both spirit and action and CMS VATAVARAN team comprehended it completely. In fact during the planning stage of the festival itself a great deal of brainstorming was done to make sure that more and more eco-friendly products were used during the festival to reduce the carbon footprints. This being the deciding criteria, all the products were carefully chosen to adhere to the green factor.

Efforts were put in to reduce the carbon footprints by ensuring more and more use of ecofriendly products which was appreciated by one and all. Registered delegates, students, experts, filmmakers and visitors took note of the efforts made by the team in making the festival green in true sense of the term and applauded the work done in this regard.

Less Printing: The festival's decision to reduce printing and providing online documents saved paper and printing cost. The same was applied for Entry Forms and Guidelines; Festival Publications: CMS VATAVARAN 2014 Festival Directory, Festival Book, Impact & Legacy Brochure and 10 Years Award-wining film Directory; Festival Schedules & Invitations and Digital Backdrops.

<u>Online Registration</u>: The delegate registration was made online and it was mandatory for all participants, partners and speakers to register themselves. This again was a cost-effective and eco-friendly mode of registration.

Environmental Friendly Material for Festival Merchandise:

Delegate notebooks, note pads, memo pads were made of handmade chlorine free paper. Delegate badges were made up of cardboard and cloth and delegate bags were made up of eco-friendly cloth.

<u>Solar Rickshaws</u>: An eco-friendly solarised E-rickshaw was provided by Maharaja Power, the festival partner to ferry festival guests and participants inside the IGNCA campus.

Solar Lanterns: Festival partners Sukam and Maharaja Power provided solar lanterns which was another significant evidence of an eco-friendly festival.

<u>Festival Décor</u>: Prominent Schools of Delhi and National Capital Region (NCR) i.e. Shri Ram Group of Schools, Bloom Public School and Sri Venkateshwar International School contributed in festival decor. Besides this, Wildlife Trust of India also displayed its 40-feet inflated whale shark in the festival venue.

4.2 Thematic Discourses contributed in specialised knowledge network

- CMS VATAVARAN 2014 organised 70 sessions and invited 150 speakers and thus
 contributed in creation of specialised knowledge networking platforms on new
 biodiversity knowledge, expertise, practices and solutions.

CMS Environment's green film collection is now richer by 541 number of new titles received from Indian and international filmmakers. These films cover issues like biodiversity conservation, climate change, sustainable technologies, livelihoods and water. The films made on or after January 1, 2011 were only accepted in this competition.
